Course Descriptions:

TESPC 101 (3 credits) - Introduction to TESOL

In this introduction to the TESOL certificate, student will learn the essential theories and practice basic principles of teaching English as a foreign language.

TESOL 102 (3 credits) – TESOL Pedagogy I

This is the first of two courses on EFL teaching methodology. This course emphasizes benefits of foreign language learning, language acquisition theory, communicative language teaching, major and minor teaching methodologies, and teaching speaking, listening, reading, writing, and culture.

TESOL 103 (3 credits) – TESOL Pedagogy II

The second of two courses on EFL teaching methodology. This course emphasizes (1) technology, (2) cross-cultural differences, (3) classroom management, and (4) assessment.

TESOL 104 (3 credits) – English Grammar for TESOL

A detailed study of English from the perspective of those who will teach it to speakers of other languages. Emphasis will be on helping students make sense of grammar so they can help others improve their English skills.

TESOL 105 (1 credit) – TESOL Practice

In this course, students will review basic principles of language acquisition and language pedagogy.

ED 312 (2 credits) – Culture and Diversity

Students will analyze historic and present-day relationships between the American educational system and cultural dynamics. They will identify prejudices and discriminatory practices, their causes and influence on education today.
